

Girl Noticed comes to Anchorage. We partnered with artist Lori Pratico and many other community groups to bring this nationally renowned program to Anchorage.




HomeBuyer Fair - First time for us to partner with Cook Inlet Housing Authority's Lending Center to promote homeownership.
